

Introduction of the ENGAGE for ESG initiative

© The ENGAGE for ESG initiative

- The ENGAGE for ESG initiative aims to contribute to the goals of the EU Green Deal, namely, to the activation of sustainable investments in the building sector, by promoting ESG transparency for residential mortgages and home renovation loans.
- The ENGAGE Templates 1.1, released in August 2024, include data elements that allow financial institutions to disclose the alignment of their mortgages with the EU Taxonomy requirements in line with the Substantial Contribution Criteria and Do Not Significant Harm of the Climate Delegated Act for the economic activities of acquisition and ownership of real estate, as well as the minimum safeguards.
- The Templates will also enable the assessment of the degree of sustainability for mortgages and the classification of investments for certain mortgages as "sustainable" according to the EU Taxonomy.
- Version 1.2 of the ENGAGE Templates, which focuses on home renovation loans, will become available before the end of 2024.
- The Templates will be updated and expanded over the coming years to incorporate the most relevant European sustainability regulations. They are currently being operationalised through the ENGAGE Portal, an IT infrastructure available from November 2024.
- All institutions are invited to test the Templates and the Portal upon request to engage4esg@eurodw.eu














ENGAGE: The High-Level Concept

- A future proof format for real estate data encompassing Europe's most relevant regulatory and sustainable finance requirements
- Converting regulatory sustainable finance regulation into requirements incorporating both the consumer and the financial institution perspective





The ENGAGE Templates Structure

Building block
1 created

Building blocks 2 & 3 under construction Building block 0 • Current ESMA underlying exposures for residential mortgages (Annex 2) and consumer loans (Annex 6)

Building block 1

- Compliance with the EU Taxonomy Regulation for:
- a) Mortgages for the acquisition of new buildings and existing buildings;
- b) Loans for the renovation of existing buildings.

Building block 2

- European Investment Bank information requirements to capture:
- a) Funds from green programmes for the renovation wave;
- b) Green Eligibility Checker for buildings renovations.


Building block 3 • European Central Bank stress test fields related to climate change (such as flooding and heating) for financing activities related to the building stock.

The programme includes a web portal with online tools and a bilateral advisory offer.



- Online tool helping banking/leasing institutions assess green eligibility of projects, estimate their impact and produce PDF report with assessment results;
- <u>Upcoming work priorities</u>: expand the tool's coverage to **new investment sectors** and EU Taxonomy objectives, and improve the tool's reporting functionalities.



EIF Sustainability Guarantee Tool

- Online tool built on the basis of the Green Checker, adapted to the eligibility criteria of the InvestEU Sustainability Portfolio Guarantee Product developed by EIF and EC;
- <u>Upcoming work priorities</u>: maintain alignment with the **evolving eligibility criteria** (Use Case Document) and mandate specificities (DNSH criteria under the Recovery and Resilience Facility).




Green Guide for Fund Managers

• The ENGAGE Team is available for clarifications on the ENGAGE Templates

Several sessions have already been set up with interested parties



- Available from November 2024, subject to a standard legal arrangement (available upon request)
- Free of charge until October 2025
- Possibility to submit the ENGAGE sample files various times enriching the information

Economic activities - Scope for ENGAGE

When developing version 1.1 of the ENGAGE Templates, the ENGAGE Consortium has considered:

- ENGAGE data framework is an addon to existing market best practices
- ENGAGE data framework is scalable. Meaning that if in the first phase the focus is on the EU Taxonomy, other elements can be incorporated at a later timeframe.
- New in v1.1:
 - Fields for DNSH
 - Minor improvements in datatype / description



Fields used for Taxonomy Technical Screening Criteria (TSC) assessment

- Fields with N are <u>not</u> optional for the TSC assessment for that economic activity.
- Fields with Y are not needed per se for the specific check, for that economic activity.



We have transparently indicated per economic activity which data fields the ENGAGE Portal applies in the TSC assessment.

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European Commission call for evidence on the establishment of a portfolio framework

- On 8 October 2024 the European Commission launched a call for evidence on an initiative laying down a comprehensive portfolio framework for voluntary use by financial institutions.
- The initiative aims to:
- 1. increase lending volumes for energy renovations, in line with EU energy and decarbonisation targets;
- 2. protect vulnerable households;
- 3. outline best practices to encourage lenders to prioritise the worst-performing buildings.
- The establishment of a portfolio framework is announced in Article 17(10) of the EPBD recast.
- The deadline for the submission of feedback is 5 November 2024.
- A public consultation building on the feedback received for the call for evidence is intended to be launched in late 2025.

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European Commission call for evidence on the establishment of a portfolio framework

- The purpose of the call for evidence is to gather opinions from stakeholders on the added value of a portfolio framework to guide financial institutions and facilitate access to financing for energy performance renovations of buildings.
- The call for evidence also aims to collect relevant data and feedback on:
 - > current financing of energy performance renovation and the role of financial institutions;
 - > potential barriers and obstacles;
 - best practices and future options to increase financing volumes; and
 - interaction with existing legislation, including the Sustainable Finance framework.


Targeted consultation on the functioning of the EU securitisation framework

- On 9 October 2024 the European Commission launched a targeted consultation on the functioning of the FU securitisation framework.
- Question 12.8 of the targeted consultation is referring to the role of securitisation for the green transition, asking for input with regards to the initiative that could be taken in the industry or in the regulatory field.
- Deadline: 4 December 2024


